In 1980, by convention vote, the name of the fund was changed to the **Chloe Monroe MDA Fund**, in honor of past state president, Chloe Monroe.

Today, donations support annual contributions to the M.D. Anderson Cancer Research Center in Houston in the form of grants for research projects. Each spring the Texas BPW Foundation Executive Council tours this amazing facility and hear proposals from research doctors in need of funding. A couple of the recent grants we have given were for CXCR4, Leukemia research, Genetic testing for inherited Breast and Ovarian Cancer Syndromes, and research of an old drug for women with endometrial cancer.

M D Anderson Hospital is there for all Texans. It is a marvelous facility, covering many acres in downtown Houston and employing over 20,000 doctors, nurses, and staff.
