Members of Uptown Midland Business and Professional Women helped the Salvation Army on Dec. 3 with time at their famous red kettle. The women were joined by the Army’s Advisory Board and University of Texas of the Permian Basin students to help raise donations for the organization as well as for Lone Star Animal Sanctuary and Matt’s Backpack s for the Homeless.

“These three charities are in desperate need of donations, especially during our cold and rainy weather,” BPW director Jonna Smoot said.

As both BPW and Salvation Army Advisory Board members took shifts at the kettle — both inside and outside of the mall — Dillard’s manager Sandra Crain hosted the other organizations at the center of the store’s main entrance. UTPB Enactus students accepted donations to Lone Star Animal Sanctuary and Matt’s BackPack while also talking to shoppers about the missions of each agency.

They really made everyone who gave feel so special and like they really were a part of something larger,” Smoot said.

Enactus is an international nonprofit that works to inspire students to better the world through entrepreneurial action. Matt’s Backpacks provides supplies and packs to the homeless population in Odessa.
