Medical Update.....and Art.....Diane Browne

I finally went to a post surgery follow-up appointment with my surgeon in Dallas. A new MRI confirmed that the entire brain tumor had been removed! The doctor said I could wait 3 years to come back again.

In the mean time, I found out a little more of what they did to me. "The nervus intermedius was removed with the tumor which controls the tear gland. That is what has resulted in your dry eye. That nerve also controls taste on one

side of the tongue so if you have a sour taste on your tongue that is the reason. We did remove a portion of your inner ear to get to the tumor. We had to cut the balance nerves to remove the tumor as that is where it came from. Having equilibrium issues is pretty common, but they usually improve over time. Your balance may always be a problem, but usually it is not that far off from pre surgery status."

I am settling in to my BiCros hearing aid system which takes what my deaf ear would hear and sends it to my "good" ear, which is bad!?! With this system, I don't feel quite as deaf, but nothing is going to help overcome recognizing what direction sound is coming from. The most helpful actions are getting my attention, and allowing me to see your face so I can read lips.

As frustrating as my challenges are, I am very grateful for such a positive outcome and appreciate all the support and prayers from everyone. Diane -

June 14th Flag Day......

In the United States, **Flag Day** is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day by resolution of the Second Continental Congress in 1777.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.

One of the longest-running Flag Day parades is held annually in Quincy, Massachusetts, which began in 1952, celebrating its 59th year in 2010. The 59th Annual Appleton Wisconsin 2009 Flag Day Parade featured the U.S. Navy.

The largest Flag Day parade is held annually in Troy, New York, which bases its parade on the Quincy parade and typically draws 50,000 spectators. Perhaps the oldest continuing Flag Day parade is at Fairfield, Washington. Beginning in 1909 or 1910, Fairfield has held a parade every year since, with the possible exception of 1918, and celebrated the "Centennial" parade in 2010, along with some other commemorative events.

Why red, white and blue? To the original members of the Continental Congress, red stood for hardiness and courage, white for purity and innocence, and blue for vigilance and justice



Why thirteen stars and stripes? They represented the thirteen American colonies which rallied around the new flag in their fight against the British for self-governance.

The thirteen colonies included Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and Virginia.

To this day, thirteen stripes still commemorate the original colonies. Instead of thirteen stars, today the number of stars on the US flag has grown to 50, representing every state in the Union
