BPW President Deploys to Disaster Relief Operation in Pecos, Texas...

On September 20th, Stephanie Murphree - BPW President, was called to respond to flooding in Pecos, Texas where the Pecos River had risen and impacted residential neighborhoods on the Northeast side of town. Upon arriving to Pecos, Stephanie, along with other Red Cross volunteers and staff sprang into action opening a shelter for those who were forced to evacuate. The shelter remained opened for 5 days, sheltering 10 residents at one time. While shelter populations were minimal during the duration of the disaster, the American Red Cross also led feeding operations for all emergency personnel who were on the ground working the disaster relief operations. In total, the American Red Cross served over 825 meals, nearly 1,100 snacks, and offered over 240 clean up supplies (rakes, shovels, trash bags, etc.). The American Red Cross was not only able to challenge their volunteers' sheltering skills, but strengthened partnerships within within the local community and region. This was Stephanie's first deployment, and in her words "a huge success!"
