Smitty and I went to Kerrville and camped out at the Guadalupe River RV Resort several weeks ago. We just hung out and took it easy, took in the local sites. One we stopped to check out (we had seen it several times but never had the time to stop and check it out) was the giant Cross on Interstate 10, just west of the Fredericksburg Hwy. The Empty Cross is 77.7 feet tall., the center space is exactly 7' wide, weighs 70 tons, is 7 stories tall and the cross arm is exactly 40' wide. It is incredible to stand inside of it.

The Coming King Sculpture Prayer Garden is located at the same latitude as Israel and approximately halfway between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans.

The Prayer Garden is not finished because it is being built using only donated funds and they plan to have many more sculptures, benches, walking paths, etc.. The artwork is truly beautiful.

LABOR DAY.....

Labor Day in the United States is a holiday celebrated on the first Monday in September. It is a celebration of the American labor movement and it is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity and well-being of their country.

Labor Day was promoted by the Central Labor Union and the Knights of Labor, who organized the first parade in New York City. After the Haymarket Massacre, US President Grover Cleveland feared that commemorating Labor Day on May 1 could become an opportunity to commemorate the affair. Thus, in 1887, it was established as an official holiday in September to support the Labor Day that the Knights favored.

(In high society, Labor Day is (or was) considered the last day of the year when it is fashionable to wear white or seersucker!!)
