Three BPW members (myself, Kristi Hennessey & Misty Stewart) traveled to San Juan, Puerto Rico February 4-8 to attend the Annual CHPA (Corporate Housing Providers Association) Industry Conference. CHPA is a professional trade association exclusively dedicated to supporting corporate housing providers around the world. The Annual Conference provides critical networking and information to hundreds of industry decision-makers. With more than 300 member companies worldwide, CHPA is where corporate housing companies and professionals succeed. Members include providers and industry vendors that are invaluable partners to the industry's success. We also spent a free day on the island with a tour of Old San Juan and a nighttime glass bottom kayak bioluminescent adventure.



From Jonna Smoot:

Over 500 registered attendees flowed to Midland this past February 19-22 for the Year Two Permian Basin Water In Energy Conference for an over 17% increase in registered attendance. The second annual Permian Basin Water In Energy Conference (PBWIEC.com) opened February 19, 2019, with a ticketed VIP Opening Reception in the epicenter of the world's oil patch at Midland, Texas, and lasted through February 22, 2019.

The 2019 PBWIEC Event Chair, Jonna Smoot, VP, Marketing at West Texas National Bank, and an inaugural Advisory Board Member stated that, "a large part of what PBWIEC does is look at, review,

discuss and seek to address the challenges and opportunities of today's water in energy issues while looking towards our future. To that end, we have local policy and decision makers speak, we have a legal and regulatory session that compares and contrasts the Texas vs. New Mexico way of regulating, defining usage of, and controlling water issues in the Permian Basin.

PBWIEC strives to be a non-commercial conference in that it offers information and education to conference attendees vs. the standard water conference sales pitch performed at most every water conference across the states. We keep our Conference registration pricing at one of the absolute lowest in the industry to encourage local municipalities, small companies and others to be able to attend, connect and learn from our Conference. These tenets are just some of what allowed PBWIEC to sell out at 426 Conference attendees last year (Year One!) when we had hoped to maybe have 150 attendees as our best-case scenario. We sold out of every sponsorship and this year opened new categories to address that issue.

The Conference initially was the idea of UTPB's business advisory board who felt they needed to be more involved with current and pressing Permian Basin issues and opportunities.

The need for water, "in the oil and gas industry is huge and the impacts of our usage will be felt for years to come if we do not begin to understand and better manage this resource," said Jim Woodcock, one of the founding board members and Conference Chair. "Just look at the number of wells that are going to be drilled and so much of the world's oil drilling activity occurs in the Permian Basin."

In all, there were over 40 speakers and panelists over the two and a half days of Conference-related events at the Midland Horseshoe Arena. Through collaboration, education, and industry-innovation, the Conference seeks to understand and improve the protection, storage and usage of our most precious asset of water.

Smoot asserted that, "PBWIEC organizers expect the Conference to be as successful or more so than last year. We're reaching a global audience with our attendees. We've had civil water engineers from Minnesota signing up to attend with very little advertising. We've kept a laser-like focus on retaining our original tenet of not being a commercially-oriented conference. We ask our speakers to discuss their opportunities and issues in the context of water in energy and how they're managing those. A unique aspect for this year's Conference is that we have landowners speaking during the Conference. We do invite a diverse group to speak, and invite Press far and wide to attend and report on what they see, hear and experience at our event."

Conference registrants include participants from 14 States, from Arizona to California to Rhode Island, to Washington and even as far as Canada and Venezuela, with the Great State of Texas being well-represented. We had representatives from Sen. Ted Cruz's office and Sen. John Cornyn's office attend, with a personal introduction of Steve Melzer's presentation on Friday by Congressman Mike Conaway who stayed to enjoy Melzer's presentation.
